

Capital Investments

Capital projects are big-ticket investments usually funded by debt, although occasionally contributions of less than about \$250K are taken from the operating budget. Montreal West has 3 main categories of capital projects: **Infrastructure** (road/water/sewer/sidewalk renewal), **Vehicles**, and **Buildings**. Another 2 smaller categories are **Office Furniture & Equipment**, and **Machinery, Tools & Miscellaneous Equipment**. In 2022 a new category appeared on page 16 of the **Rapport Financier**: **Immobilisations en cours** (Assets in progress) which likely refers to the rec center.


Annual investments in infrastructure, the left chart below, show the lowest investments in 2020, 2022, and 2023 since 2006. Since nothing is scheduled in 2024, there will have been only one project, Fenwick Avenue in 2021, in the past five years. The flat-lining on the cumulative spending graph on the right also reflects this trend.







(A particular bug-a-boo of many people, myself included, is that since **Infrastructure Renewa**l began in 2008, it was always understood to refer to major road/water/sewer/sidewalk work, which is how it's defined in the **Rapports Financier**. However, within the last five years, the Town broadened the definition to include "Recreational" infrastructure which is clearly inconsistent with the Rapport categories found on page 3 of this file. This seems to have been done in order to claim that "infrastructure investment has continued as in the past", which is clearly not the case. It would have been useful if the Town simply stated that no infrastructure work was being done because we're saving money for the new arena!!)

The second major capital investment category is in **Vehicles**. Large expenditures – above \$200K – are likely due to big-ticket items such as the street vacuum and mega front-end loaders being added to the regular purchase of F150s, F250s, and larger trucks. (Another bug-a-boo: Any daytime dogwalker in the Town can attest to the fact that an awful lot of patrolling up one street and down the next occurs by Town vehicles. Limiting this would extend the life of many of our vehicles, and save a lot of gas -- currently over \$1,000 per **week**, not to mention pollution.)




Building capital expenses include things such as a new roof, windows, floors, and foundation work.

From 2006 through 2023 Office Furniture & Equipment totalled \$507,303, and Machinery, Tools & Miscellaneous Equipment totalled \$311,647.

The New Rec Center construction costs

Starting in 2022 a new category was added to the Rapport Financier capital projects list: "Immobilisations en cours", or "assets in progress" which must refer to the rec center. Apparently not included in 2022 expense were some \$200K of earlier costs which may, or may not, have included the original engineering study from 2016 detailing problems with the arena and costing repair options.

For any accountants reading this: The accumulated surplus decreased **\$3,797,802** from \$7,267,442 in 2021 to \$3,469,640 in 2023. Bank debt was increased by **\$1,036,800** in 2022. These two sources of funds total **\$4,834,602**, compared to rec center spending of **\$4,786,911** in this period.
